"Hausordnung" - HOUSE RULES

1. No pupil may be in the classrooms or in the passages, either before or after school, or during intervals.
2. Pupils who arrive at school very early because of transport arrangements may, during the winter months, be in the tuck shop as from 07h00.
3. Prior to the commencement of an assembly in the hall, pupils have to wait in their classrooms. The respective subject teacher or prefects will meet them there and accompany them to the hall. On their way to, and inside the hall, pupils must behave quietly and in an orderly fashion.

Any kinds of preparations in the Auditorium that need to be tackled prior to an event are to be supervised by a teacher. School management should be informed about all the organisational details at least four weeks before the event is to take place. Security for all concerned is of utmost importance and all aspects of this must be discussed with the general manager. Please note that events that involve open fires are prohibited in the Auditorium.

4. Apart from changing classrooms from one period to the next, and apart from the two intervals, pupils may not leave the classroom between periods or during lessons without explicit permission from the teacher. This rule is also applicable to periods during which pupils are working in class without specific supervision by a teacher.
5. Pupils may spend their free periods either in the library, or in the common room.
6. Pupils may not leave the grounds during school hours without permission. Such permission may be granted:
 - a) for a single period: by the subject teacher;
 - b) for more periods than one, up to and including one day: by the class teacher.
7. Pupils must, during intervals, be in the areas plotted on the "interval plan". They must behave in such a manner that they do not endanger themselves or their fellow-pupils, and that they do not damage school property. Any form of throwing about anything and ball-games played anywhere near windows are forbidden.
8. Pupils must return to the classrooms immediately on the first bell signalling the end of break.
9. Pupils are not to enter the staff-room
10. Pupils are jointly responsible for general tidiness, and especially for neatness and tidiness in their classrooms.

11. The school uniform must be neat and tidy and must be worn in accordance with regulations laid down in the rules on school uniform.
12. Outside school, and especially on public buses and trains, pupils must behave themselves in an irreproachable manner in order that the good repute of the school be maintained.
13. Smoking and the drinking of alcoholic beverages are forbidden to pupils:
 - a) on the school grounds;
 - b) at all school activities within as well as outside the school;
 - c) in school uniform.The Principal-in-Committee (Schulleitung) reserves the right to exercise exceptions to this rule, e.g. with regard to school dances.
14. The use of cellular phones and I-Pods is prohibited during school time
 - a) Cellular phones may be taken to school for security reasons (communication with parents) but have to be kept safe at all times.
 - b) Cellular phones and music devices (such as I-Pods) must not be switched on from the beginning of the first to the end of the last school period.
 - c) Learners who do not adhere to these rules will have their device confiscated and may claim it back from the principal after the end of the last period.
